

## Background

#### 1) Disability are unique to each person

- Disability vary in different aspects
  - Degree of disability (Total/Partial)
  - Disability since birth or acquired
  - Educational opportunities (Braille/Sign Language)
- The way people with disability read and share books varies
  - Visually Impaired
    - Baillie, Enlarged Text, Glasses etc.
  - Hearing Impaired
    - Sign Language, Oralism, Written Conversation, Hearing Aid etc.

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2) Need to support parent and baby in pairs

→ Very Complicated

In Bookstart, people who gift packs need to

- Identify and address the pair's needs individually.
- Connect the pair to the constant and long-term support of booksharing.

#### **Babies with Visual Impairement**

- Using body
- Using the real objects to support understanding
- People who have low vision, Illustrations such as clear contrast of colours, bold outlines in vivid colours, simple shapes, simple background etc. are preffered.

#### **Babies with Hearing Impairement**

- Using body and gestures
- Take enough time for looking at the pictures.
- They observe illustrations as well as facial expression of the reader.
- Maybe difficult to fully enjoy books with rhythmical texts or onomatopoeia.








