- Singing other nursery rhymes like colour, numbers and action songs,
- Closure of the reading session.



'Magic of Stories' and 'The Pleasure of Reading'



Aims of the 'Magic of Stories' and 'The Reading for Pleasure' programmes:

- Instil the love and enjoyment of books,
- Motivation to read,
- Books are pleasurable and informative,
- Role models for parents/carers,
- •Demonstrate to parents how to read aloud to their children.



Benefits of reading aloud:

- Language development,
- Demonstrate the reading process,
- •Help the child to prepare for independent reading and learning by building literacy skills,
- Develop print convention skills.

Choice of age appropriate books and resources provided by The National Literacy Agency





Methodology focuses on:

- Comprehension of the story;
- Promotion critical thinking skills.
- •Strategies are organized into a three-part framework, with specific activities used before, during, and after reading.

Before reading:

- How to activate children's prior knowledge which will help them access the content,
- How to make story/text relevant to children,
- How to help children make predictions.

During reading:

- Ask questions to promote critical thinking skills,
- Use drama improvisation like role play, freeze etc.
- Hold discussions,
- Visualize characters, settings, plot or events,
- Return to predictions children have made.

- After reading
- Recall and retell the story in the children's own words,
- Assimilate through dramatic play, music, debate,
- Evaluate and discuss ideas encountered in the story,
- Apply these ideas to real-life situations.

Planning a reading aloud session





Continous Profession Development

Further training is given periodically:

- Voice projection and intonation
- Drama improvisation
- Language development
- Questioning technique for critical thinking skills
- Visualising a story
- Basic elements of a story
